Eden makes facemasks, soap and hand sanitiser for distribution

LIFT partners Eden and New Hope are working to distribute supplies and information to vulnerable communities at risk for COVID-19. Instead of jewellery-making, women at Eden's shelter are now making facemasks, soap and hand sanitiser to address the immediate needs of communities during the COVID-19 pandemic. At least 8,000 households, or around 40,000 people, will soon receive a combination of prevention supplies and awareness-raising items.



Delivering emergency assistance to returning migrants

Tens of thousands of Myanmar migrants workers are coming home from Thailand. With support from the LIFT-funded ILO project "Developing Internal and International Migration Governance", civil society and labour organisations are on the front-line of Myanmar's response to the COVID-19 crisis: the Migrant Worker Resource Centre is delivering emergency assistance to returning migrants at the Tachileik border, such as drinking water, health information, and precautionary guidelines to prevent infection.

Working together to change behaviours and improve nutrition

The MCCT programme was introduced in Myanmar by LIFT. MCCT aims to improve nutrition for pregnant women and a child's first 1,000 days. In February, LIFT met with the Ministry of Social Welfare Relief and Resettlements, the Ministry of Health and Sports, as well as nutrition partners, to discuss SBCC activities in MCCT programmes.
